MINUTES OF THE BENTON CITY COUNCIL
Regular Session
August 25, 2014
Benton Municipal Complex

The Benton City Council was called to order for a regular session at 7:00 p.m.

The Mayor gave the invocation.

Alderman Murphy led the pledge of allegiance.

Roll was called.

When roll was called ten (10) council members were present. A quorum was declared.

The Mayor requested approval for the July 28, 2014 council meeting minutes. Alderman Lee made a motion to approve the minutes. Seconded by Alderman Moore. The Mayor called for a voice vote on the approval of the minutes. All aldermen replied in the affirmative. The minutes for the July 28, 2014 council meeting were approved with 10 affirmative votes.

Madeline Wilson was recognized for 10 years of service with the city. Michelle Gibson was recognized for 15 years of service with the city. Darren Hass was recognized for 25 years of service with the city.

John Eckart was selected as the July employee of the month.

The next item on the agenda was committee reports and motions. It was voted on in the agenda meeting that Ordinance 54 of 2014 - An Ordinance Rezoning Certain Land in the City of Benton, Saline County Arkansas; Declaring an Emergency; and for Other Purposes be moved up on the agenda. This was for the Planned Unit Development (PUD) of Longhills golf course property, the Links at Longhills. Alderman Terrell asked for the first reading of Ordinance 54 of 2014. Seconded by Alderman Lee. The ordinance was read by the city clerk. The Mayor asked for any comments. Stanley Garver, 4583 Shoal Creek stated that he lived on the 13th tee box of the golf course. When it first started I was adamantly opposed to it but after dealing with them, talking with them and seeing the changes that they have made to meet all of our needs of what we wanted in the area I am 100% for them. The city needs this; they need the revenue from it. My understanding is that the golf course is paying roughly \$36,000 per year in taxes. The new revenue will be somewhere in the neighborhood of \$400,000. That is a lot of money for the city to leave on the table for something that we dearly need. Longhills is near and dear to most of us in Benton. We grew

up there and played there along with our kids. We would like to see it revitalized, cleaned up and brought to where it needs to be. Anthony Baker, 3012 St. Andrews stated that he was a letter carrier in the area when the Lindsey Corporation started building apartments on west Baseline. I saw the whole thing from the beginning and carried the mail there for five years after the people moved in. It is always a concern when you have an established neighborhood and you have apartments coming in, you have a concern of what type of people will be staying in those apartments. I can say from my experience that Lindsey screens the people well. Lindsey is a top notch company and I don't think we will have any problems with the type of people who will be living in the apartments. We are for this and want them to bring it in. This will give us the golf course that is needed now.

Amanda Bird, Dark Forest resident stated that she was not coming to oppose the apartment complex but to ask for some modifications for her neighborhood. I ask that you consider not having the entrance on Longhills Road. We are concerned about the possibility of traffic issues, with an additional 793 vehicles plus spouses. I am also concerned about people cutting through our neighborhood to get to the service road. Kids ride bikes and walk in our neighborhood. Please consider rerouting the entrance so that it is not on Longhills Road. We also would like you to consider leaving the greenery up so that there is a screen between the houses in our subdivision and the apartments. Our main concern is the entrance. Bud Busken, major stockholder of Longhills Golf Course stated that he also lives in Dark Forest and I respectfully understand her concerns. Longhills has been part of this community since 1955. Benton needs their golf course, we need it back. In the golf world today the golf business is terrible. I don't see anything drastically changing that. We are very fortunate that the Lindsey's are willing to come in here and keep Longhills a golf course. When Jeff and I took over the reins in 1986, the only reason we got the range was because Mr. Martin knew that we wanted to keep it a golf course. That was always foremost in our minds. Mr. Garver generalized but I took the numbers from last time when we had 1200 units and cut them back to be equivalent to 792 units. What that should generate is \$275,000 for the school district, \$63,000 for the county and \$30,000 for the city. That is substantial and the community needs that income. Concerning the traffic concerns, today I started at Mr. Davis' house who lives at the corner of Longhills Road and Deer Drive and went four different ways to Lincoln Square to the new Kum and Go. The difference in time was no more than 30 seconds. If people are going to Benton from the PUD they are going to go to Hwy 5 and drive the four lanes to town. If they are going to the Waffle House, they will probably go the service road. I don't see that many people going through Dark Forest. Ken Quick, 2818 Crooked Stick stated this past Sunday the Longhills POA held our annual meeting with over 200 residents in attendance. The primary topic of discussion was Lindsey's current golf course proposal for city council approval. Based on the responses, I can say that the folks who are most impacted by this project are generally in agreement that it is time to move on. It is time to allow Bud and Jeff to sell the golf course so that they can retire. It is time to heal the bad feelings between our neighbors. It is time to replace our field of weeds with a golf course. Lindsey's efforts to address residences concerns over the past three years and their long term commitment to operating a golf course should be reassuring to our community. It is time to move on and forward. When you consider this proposal I hope you will agree and vote to approve. Jeff Collum, resident of Longhills and Benton School District Superintendent stated that he moved into the neighborhood two and ½ years ago. We live on the front end of the 11th fairway. When we bought the house it was a very nice looking tee box out the back window and we could watch golfers go by. That was one of the reasons that we chose the neighborhood and chose that house. The last two years we have watched what appears to be a cow pasture slash four wheeler jumping ramp.

Personally I would like to see it come back. From the school districts standpoint if you are talking about 600 apartment units and one third of those have children so around 200 students show up. Some of the concerns that have come forward are do we have space for those students. Right now we are at a balanced enrollment which means we are at a place where we do have room for some growth but we have a six year long range facility plan which we have approved that will open up 400 to 600 seats across the district so we can take on the growth. We are making preparation now. From a revenue standpoint every student that walks in is \$6,300 per head so if 200 students show up at our doorstep that is about \$1.2 million in revenue in addition to the \$275,000 that was mentioned earlier. So \$1.5 million in a constant revenue stream that will always help the school district from now and moving forward in the future. So personally I am in favor of it and also from the school district standpoint.

Alderman Terrell made a motion to suspend the rules. Seconded by Alderman Lee. The Mayor asked that the roll be called on the motion to suspend. Alderman Moore stated that this afternoon we received an email from one of the residents there and wanted to discuss that to make sure their concerns have been addressed regarding the wording in the ordinance, regarding the LLC v Longhills Property Inc. Mr. Houston stated that he had a copy of the petition that was filed with the Saline County Circuit Court. It is styled Longhills Inc. v Longhills Property, LLC and then list some 20 odd names after that. If you will note in your ordinance I said Longhills Inc. v Longhills Property, LLC, et al. Et al means everybody else. Alderman Moore stated also in that email there were the terms of the settlement specific to the way that the apartments would be constructed and the term of how certain construction would happen as far as in phases. Is it material at this point to add that to our official record? Mr. Houston stated no. The settlement agreement is a private agreement and the city of Benton is not a party to that. Nor would we ever enforce that private party settlement agreement. The only thing we would do is enforce our PUD ordinance and that is all we would do. We would never enforce that sort of like bills of assurance. The city does not enforce bills of assurance. In this situation issues came up about the covenant. The city stood back and did not enforce the covenant. It allowed the private property owners to resolve that among themselves. Same thing here. The Mayor asked the roll to be called. Nikki Chumley reported 55,452 people have been in attendance at the Benton Event Center since its opening. In the last month, she has booked 25 new events, and several of those are for week day conferences. Ace Signs has installed the new inside signage and it is working very well.

V. OLD BUSINESS

Gary James reported that Hoop Fest, an event that was scheduled for Labor Day weekend, has been cancelled. The A & P Commission had originally agreed to give \$10,000 to that event.

Jerry Ponder made a motion to give the \$10,000 designated for Hoop Fest to Amplify. After discussion, Jerry Ponder withdrew his motion. He made the motion that the A & P give an additional \$7500 to Amplify, making the total A & P Commission funding for that event \$10,000. Motion was seconded by Elgin Hamner IV. Motion carried.

Mark Fikes asked City Attorney Brent Houston for a ruling on whether the A & P Commission could give money toward the mural that is being planned for downtown. Commissioners will receive a copy of his ruling by email tomorrow.

A. Chairman Mark Fikes reminded the commissioners that it is time to begin thinking about the 2015 budget. He asked that the commissioners consider taking \$25,000 from the usual appropriated community donation and use it to pay toward the bond debt.

B. The commissioners also discussed the change in-laws that refer to suspension of rules for funding. Luke Moody made the motion that no suspension of rules in regard to funding would be in order in 2015. Elgin Hamner IV seconded. Motion passed.

C. Prices were presented by 3 companies for moving the Sabora sign. They are as follows: AR Sign & Neon, \$9491.72; Seiz Signs, \$8150.00; and Ace Signs, \$4500.00. The quoted costs include the movement as well as the

electricity. Jeff Stechman made the motion to give the contract to ACE Signs; Elgin Hamner IV seconded; motion carried.

Public Utility Commission Meeting Summary of the August 18, 2014 Meeting

1. Discussion on Review Committee Mayor Mattingly wants to set up to address Employee Compensation. Mr. McKinney said last week the Mayor sent him an email that he had met with the Commission and Chairman Phil Miller. They got word that we were in agreement with participating in Johansson report being updated. Last Wednesday, the Mayor came up with a proposal for a 5 member committee. The Committee would be the Mayor, the Chairman of the City Council Personnel Committee (Alderman Donner), the General Manager of Benton Utilities, a member of the Public Utilities Commission and the Human Resources Manager. When they did the first deal with Johansson back in 2006 they paid \$17,400.00 for the DB Compensation License. From October, 2006 to November, 2010, the City paid Mr. Now they are proposing to offer the City access to the new 8.0 software by secure internet connection, and transfer the City's current DB Compensation database to the 8.0 software, complete a current market pay study and make a recommendation on an updated employee compensation structure and plan for 2015. Their bill will consist of an fees for an updated DB Compensation of the 8.0 Software \$4,950, an annual software support and upgrade fee for 2 years of \$2,000 and an employee pay study for 2014 of #3,000. This comes up to \$9,900. There are 2 annual installments that would be paid of \$4,950 per year. This would split that between the PUC and the Mayor. A motion was made and seconded that we participate with the \$9,900 over 2 years and 50% for the new study. A vote was taken and approved unanimously. A motion was then made and seconded to have Member Ferrell serve on this committee. A vote was taken and unanimous approval given.

2. Update on the EPA's efforts to force a reduction of approximately 44% in CO2 emissions in Arkansas and how it may affect the area. Arkansas has been tagged with 44%. In the state of Arkansas, approximately half of our energy is generated by coal. SWEPCO just made an announcement that they plan on closing all their coal plants except Turk, which is the brand new one down in Southwest Arkansas. It is environmentally compliant. They are going to close the rest of them as time goes on. Plum Point is compliant. It is one of the cleanest in the country. Turk is supposed to be the cleanest because it is the most recent. Last week on the 14th there was an interim resolution 2013-007 that was approved by the Interim Senate Committee on Insurance and Commerce and the Interim House Committee on Insurance and Commerce oppose the adoption and implementation of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's proposed rule for performance standards for reducing carbon dioxide emissions from existing power plants under the Clean Air Act Section 111(d) announced on June 2, 2014. In that agreement they stated "the proposed rule will be devastating to the state's economy and energy industry and is therefore contrary to the public policy of the State of Arkansas". They also said "Be it jointly resolved by the Interim Senate Committee on Insurance and Commerce and the Interim House Committee on Insurance and Commerce of the eighty-ninth General Assembly of the State of Arkansas". They also put out an email that basically identified how it would affect the State's economy. It is fairly detailed but is very negative to the State of Arkansas because the cost of power will run some businesses out of the state of Arkansas. They said it will affect 25% of the people in the State of Arkansas in some manner.

3. Discussion and approval of breakdown on 4.1% pay increase which was approved at July 21st meeting. Ms. Kirk said from our work session that we had, we agreed that 3% would be a cost of living

increase. The remaining 1.1% we talked about would be a merit based on the midyear performance evaluations and there is a breakdown for the rating as far as how much of the 1.1% is allotted to each employee. It will apply to all full time employees of Benton Utilities. It will be restricted to 3% for anyone that was hired after January 1, 2014. Anyone that this would take above the pay scale that was established January 1, 2012, will be allowed the full benefit of the increase but after that they will be frozen and not eligible for any future pay increases until such time that the pay scale is changed that would allow for an increase within the established range for their job grade. Anyone hired after June 30 will not be eligible for any type of raise. The raises will be retroactive to June 30 for those who are eligible. A motion was made and seconded that the Commission accepts the breakdown that was established and prepared as listed with 3% COLA and 1.1% merit to those receiving that as listed on this paper and also the onetime increase for those who are outside of their employee job rate with raises being retroactive to June 30, 2014.

4. Update on the progression of the new 250,000 gallon water tower for Hurricane Lakes. The contractor is on the site. We have 2 separate contracts on that project; the line work up to the tank and then the tank itself. The line work up to the tank is completed. There are a couple of minor odd and end things left to do, but they are a very minimal amount. The tank contractor is on site. They are basically getting all the footer holes dug. They were buying all the rebar and all the structural elements for putting in the holes to pour and form up the concrete. They went through some submittals the other day on some piping, rebar and concrete. There are a couple of modifications to be done to the vaults that didn't involve any change orders. They should be ready to pour some concrete, if weather permits, late this week or next week. It's moving along.

5. Discussion on tax exempt status of the Share Program. We have now received the tax exempt status paperwork and it is all done. The Share Board will be responsible each year to get that filed. Jordan Woolbright said if the Share Board needs any help with it they will be more than happy to help with it.

6. Member Martin said there was an email published about an issue with the substation gate from a Mr. John Pelton. He asked if we are going to build a gate or stop the 4 wheelers from running around the gate on his property. Mr. McKinney explained Entergy has a gate and we have a key to it so we can get to our part of the substation. People are going around the gate and coming back on that gravel and then going over to where the transmission line is. Entergy keeps this area mowed and 4 wheelers like to go up and down those hills. The problem is that they are not doing any damage to Benton. It is actually Entergy's area. This gentleman believes we should put a fence down his property line to prevent this from going on. The part of his property that is touching is right there where the gate is. We are going to try to improve the gate because the gate could stand some work. It is Entergy's gate so we have to talk to them and get their permission but we are not going to put a fence down that line because it is not our property. We don't have anything in there other than we have our half of the substation that is over there. The rest of the land is all Entergy's land. I guess that is where we stand now. It has not been resolved.

7. Member Martin asked if we have any obligation to respond to the County Fair Board about putting a three phase into the fair grounds. McKinney said we called Mr. Ed Jetton and made sure he knew it was \$990.00 that it would cost the fair board to get 3 Phase. They got a grant for the air conditioner and it cost all the money they had to buy that air conditioner. They need 3 Phase to the old Armory Building, and

they have asked us to put that in, and Mr. Fitzhugh gave them a price. The price Mr. Fitzhugh gave them was very, very fair because the fact that it is single phase and we have to put all new wire into that building, we have to set new poles and we have to do a lot of work for them and for that, Mr. Fitzhugh did not charge them. All he charged them for was the material, and that was the transformer and switch. That was it. It was roughly \$990.00. Mr. McKinney said they are setting up a meeting and will probably go to the Fair Board one night and explain everything. We have always been able to work with them in the past.

8. Member Martin asked if we responded to North Side Electric regarding our cutting our meter seals and let them know we object to that. Mr. McKinney said yes we have. We have been working with Mr. Brent Houston and he said we will probably have to have the City Council pass an ordinance. It is illegal to do that. We are not saying they can't do it, but we are saying they can't do it without notifying us. We know they will in emergencies and stuff but all they have to do is call and say, "Hey, we are breaking this seal". The problem is we are getting into situations where they are just doing the work and then later on we find out about it, and it may or may not be to code. It has to be inspected too by the City. Community Development should be involved in a lot of those cases. We are working on that. Our goal is to possibly get a resolution or something, but Mr. Houston will bring it to you gentlemen and have you approve it, and then take it to the City Council through Mr. Herzfeld.



NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Benton, Arkansas, that:

SECTION 1: For the reasons stated above, the City Attorney is hereby authorized to bring a cause of action in the Saline County Circuit Court seeking a court order to abate a public nuisance located at 1116 Alcoa Road, Benton, Arkansas.
