BENTON ADVERTISING & PROMOTION COMMISSION Called Meeting Minutes July 27, 2023

I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Bill Eldridge called the called meeting of the Benton Advertising & Promotion Commission to order on July 27, 2023 at 3:31 pm at the Benton Municipal Complex in Council Chambers.

II. ROLL CALL

Commissioners in attendance included: Bill Eldridge, Steve Brown, Steve Lee and Luke Moody. Alison Burch and Elgin Hamner IV were absent.

III. MINUTES

Steve Brown made a motion to approve the minutes of the July 12, 2023 meeting. Steve Lee seconded. Motion carried.

IV. REVIEW OF BIDS

Bill Eldridge explained that the A&P Commission previously approved using A&P funds to purchase approximately 511 acres of land owned by Jim Thomas located at Exit 114 and the city entered into an agreement to purchase the land. During the process of selling the land, Mr. Thomas was contacted by a representative from a company inquiring about purchasing a portion of the land along the I-30 service road. Mr. Thomas explained to the representative that he was already selling the land to the City of Benton. Bill commended Mr. Thomas for being a man of honor and integrity. A bid request was recently published for interested parties to purchase approximately 30 acres along the I-30 service road.

The deadline for bids was this morning at 11:15 and one bid was received. It's from CSMS Management, LLC to purchase 29 acres at \$77,586.21 per acre. The anticipated commercial purpose is a travel center with a \$60 million capital investment. The number of anticipated employees is 250 with compensation of \$16-\$18 per hour with insurance benefits, 401(k) and three weeks paid time off. The anticipated economic impact for the community includes \$1,250,000 annual sales tax revenue, \$275,000 annual property tax and five million visitors with over 60% of them being from outside the county and state. A proposed purchase contract was included in the bid as required. Bill Eldridge confirmed that the bid met all requirements. He explained that the total purchase price is \$2,250,000 less the real estate fee of approximately \$250,000. Starting construction of the project within one year of closing and completing the project within three years of closing is part of the requirements. Bill provided that the land was purchased for approximately \$15,000 per acre and City Attorney Baxter Drennan has reviewed the proposed contract.

Steve Brown stated this would be an exceptional opportunity for Benton to realize a substantial profit from the sale of the 29 acres and to increase revenue from sales tax and A&P tax. He believes that accepting this bid will have multi-layered benefits for the city. Both Steve Lee and Luke Moody commented that the profit from the sale of the 29 acres would put the commission in even better position for the purchase of the additional tracts of land from Mr. Thomas as planned. Bill Eldridge said building an RV park next to the 30 acres will happen next and then the endeavors planned by Parks with the remainder of the land.

Luke Moody made a motion to accept CSMS Management, LLC's bid to purchase the specific 29 acres along the I-30 service road for \$77,586.21 per acre. Steve Brown seconded. Motion carried.

V. ADJOURNMENT

Luke Moody made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Steve Brown seconded. Motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 3:40 pm.

Section 1 - General Information

Introduction: This Request for Proposal is issued by the City of Benton A&P Commission to seek a vendor to build a fence for the Thomas Park property located in the upper southwest corner between I-30 and 229 to develop commercially.

Caution to Bidders:

- 2. The City of Benton A&P Commission has the right to award this proposal to any Proposer regardless of proposal price. Proposals may not be withdrawn within 60 days after the proposals are opened. Proposal processes shall be in accordance with state law.
- 3. The City of Benton A&P Commission reserves the right to award a contract or reject any or all proposals and to waive any and all informalities associated with the proposal, if it is in the best interest of the City to do so.
