BENTON ADVERTISING & PROMOTION COMMISSION Minutes September 13, 2023

I. CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Bill Eldridge called the meeting of the Benton Advertising & Promotion Commission to order on September 13, 2023 at 3:33 pm at the Benton Municipal Complex in Council Chambers.

II. ROLL CALL

Commissioners in attendance included: Bill Eldridge, Steve Brown, Alison Burch, Luke Moody and Greg Shinn. Elgin Hamner and Steve Lee were absent.

III. OLD BUSINESS

Bill Eldridge recognized Kam South and Jack Blankenship with Retail Strategies and explained that their report is being moved up on the agenda because they need to travel to the airport for a flight. Kam and Jack thanked the commissioners for allowing them to present the first year discovery report which included the following:

- the majority of their time has been spent researching the Benton community and analyzing the results pertaining to available real estate, business categories that are not fulfilled and identifying prospective businesses that might be a good fit for Benton
- a prospect list has been created based on the research
- custom marketing materials will be created to highlight Benton to prospects
- the GAP analysis, total market demand, opportunity shortage and vacancy report
- updates on discussions about Benton with companies looking to expand some are interested in learning more about Benton while others are taking a pass for now
- the three year timeline of recruiting new businesses was reviewed

Commissioners asked the following:

Is there a feeling of momentum on this project compared with other cities they have worked with? Benton has a very strong trade area with lots of movement and activities. The feedback from potential businesses has been great and the feeling is that Benton is a strong market for growth.

Is the project on track from their experience with other cities? The project is actually ahead of schedule as it relates to the Retail Strategies three year timeline.

What is their analysis of Benton? Benton has a great capacity for new businesses regarding space and workforce. The City continues to bring in new people, which is very attractive for new retail businesses.

The commissioners thanked Kam South and Jack Blankenship for the report.

IV. MINUTES

Luke Moody made a motion to approve the minutes of the August 16, 2023 meeting. Alison Burch seconded. Motion carried.

V. FINANCIAL REPORTS

Financial reports were presented by Jordan Woolbright. The A&P Commission bank accounts show the following balances as of August 31, 2023:

A&P profit and loss statement: for the month of August 2023 total income of \$18,893.77 and total expenses of \$15,596.32 resulting in net income of \$3,297.45. For the year to date as of August 2023 total income of \$137,020.65, total operating expenses of \$119,847.36 resulting in net income of \$17,173.29.

Event Center profit and loss statement: for the month of August 2023 total income of \$64,386.86, total operating expenses of \$68,537.64 resulting in a net loss of (\$4,150.78). For the year to date as of August 2023 total income of \$508,296.07, total operating expenses of \$357,989.06 and capital expenditures of \$121,498.78 resulting in net income of \$28,808.23. Jordan explained that the repairs and maintenance expense paid in July 2023 for retrofitting and upgrading the plaza lighting in the amount of \$46,307.19 was reclassified to a capital expenditure.

Focus Group profit and loss statement: for the month of August 2023 total income of \$19,830.79 and total expenses of \$0 resulting in net income of \$19,830.79. For the year to date as of August 2023 total income of \$142,443.93 and total expenses of \$0 resulting in net income of \$142,443.93.

Mandy Spicer directed the commissioners to the list of delinquent businesses in their meeting packets. Of the thirteen businesses, eleven of them are only one month past due, one of them is older but is making payments to bring the account current and one of them is five months passed due and has made no payments and has not responded to efforts by city representatives to communicate about the account. The business that is grossly past due is a gas station. The commissioners directed Mandy to proceed with setting a hearing with the owner of the business.

Luke Moody made a motion to accept the financial reports as presented. Allison Burch seconded. Motion carried.

VII. FUNDING REQUESTS None.

IIX. REPORT FROM BENTON EVENT CENTER

Nikki Chumley reported that there have been 12 events since the last meeting including a very successful Rhea Lana's consignment sale, a multi-day conference of Arkansas county judges and several family celebrations. She continues to have many repeat vendors and the calendar is full through the rest of the year.

IX. REPORT ON THE DEVELOPMENT OF EXIT 114 PROPERTY

- A. <u>Proposals for Cultural Resources Survey</u> Bill Eldridge reported that a Request for Proposals was issued for a cultural resources survey for the Thomas property and two were received: Flat Earth Archeology, LLC for \$36,540 and Integrated Environmental Solutions, LLC for \$190,718.40. Bill provided that the survey is required to verify there is not anything on the land such as Indian relics or burial sites. Mandy Spicer provided that both proposals meet the requirements provided in the request. Luke Moody made a motion to accept the proposal from Flat Earth Archeology, LLC in the amount of \$36,540 to perform the cultural resources survey on 203 acres for the Thomas Park Project. Steve Brown seconded. Motion carried.
- B. <u>RV Park and Campground Design Proposal</u> McClelland Consulting Engineers, Inc. has submitted its proposal for services associated with the construction of an RV park and campground on the Thomas Property in the amount of \$416,250.00. The

project consists of the creation of a recreational vehicle park and necessary utilities, buildings, site amenities, stormwater detention areas and utility improvements. The scope of the proposal includes surveying and design work to create and provide the construction drawings and for the project. Civil/site permitting with the authorities having jurisdiction is included within the scope of work. The fee does not include the construction observation phase or reimbursables required of the project. The commissioners reviewed the list of services not included in the proposal as indicated on page 5 of the proposal and commented that some of them were being completed by FTN Associates. Bill reminded the commissioners that the standard hourly rate schedule previously submitted by McClelland was approved by the A&P Commission in a meeting earlier this year. Steve Brown made a motion to accept the proposal from McClelland Consulting Engineers, Inc. Luke Moody seconded. Motion carried.

C. <u>Available Grant Funds</u> – Bill Eldridge reported that the Arkansas Department of Emergency Management has grants available and the City would submit an application for the Thomas land project.

X. OLD BUSINESS

Bill Eldridge asked for discussion regarding the report given earlier in the meeting by the representatives from Retail Strategies. The discussion and comments by the commissioners included the following: the process to bring new businesses to Benton seems slow but the representatives said it is typically a 3-year process and they are ahead of schedule and expects year two to be fruitful, not many of the potential businesses are very exciting, hearing that Chick-fil-A isn't looking to expand into Benton is disappointing and A&P previously approved paying \$40,000 Retail Strategies for one year and the contract with SCEDC is up for renewal. Bill Eldridge recognized Lamont Cornwell with Saline County Economic Development Corporation. Lamont explained that communication with the Retail Strategies representatives has been very lacking and they have missed two deadlines for quarterly reports. He has elected not to renew the contract with Retail Strategies.
